



Dai Ichi Club Meeting Friday, July 18, 2014 Ben Oki



Japanese-American Ben Oki was born in Sacramento, California, in 1927. At age six, he moved to Japan, where he learned Japanese landscape and stone techniques. In 1950, Ben returned to the United States after graduating from Matsu Moto Business School, and has managed his entrepreneurship in landscape gardening ever since.

Ben is admired and in high demand worldwide as a Japanese Garden designer, especially for his use of stones in his compositions. Ben's design work includes the garden of screen star Cybil Shepard in Memphis, Tennessee, and others in the Pacific Islands and South America. Ben is a curator of the Bonsai Collections at the Huntington Library and Botanical Gardens in San Marino. California.

Ben studied bonsai under world master John Naka, and has assisted him with demonstrations and meetings. Ben has become one of the internationally known bonsai masters, and takes a key role at conventions by conducting workshops, demonstrations, and critique sessions

Seal the cuts on Broadleaf trees. Carpenter's wood glue can be used as a sealant to protect the living bark to heal and avoid die back on branches. It takes a while to cover cuts but it will happen.

This Liquid Amber has nice nabari that grips into the soil. Good drainage is needed around the trunk. The design is a slant style. The branches are young so not a lot of wiring right now.







Tree can be defoliate now. For directional pruning, look at the direction the buds are growing. Cut on an angle leaving 1/16th inch from bud.. Don't cut on a bud.

Remove low branches. Shape in an oak tree style not pine tree style allowing for a more loose design.















You don't have to do final cuts—give the eye space to see how best to style the tree.





Use a dental tool to pick back to the living bark. It stimulates and smooths the bark around the edges of old cut.



Liquid Amber comes in many colors—semi-evergreen; multi-colored with purple, red, yellow; dark maroon or yellow.



Repot next winter in a cactus mix which holds more water. Curve in at tap root to develop a healthy root structure.



Feed the tree with a slow release chemical fertilizer or organic. If mold develops, use a fungicide.


